

17-day wildlife trip to Uganda with Harrier Tours January 2022

INTRODUCTION

Being able to observe Mountain Gorillas in their natural range has been a long dream for me and visiting Uganda has been therefore always very high on my travel wish list.

The “*Pearl of Africa*” was attractive for many reasons: its wide range of various ecosystems and its connected unique biodiversity, the relative easiness to travel through the country, and the 25 primate species occurring there (from which we actually managed to see all during our trip in January 2022!).

Various intriguing recently published trip reports on **Mammalwatching.com** as well as the urgent need to get our itching feet back on the road after a long COVID-related travelling break pulled the trigger! And here we were back in November 2022: reading in details about targeted species and their occurrence, setting an itinerary, selecting a timeframe, etc.



Quite quickly, and following the above mentioned travel reports, we decided to travel with **Harrier Tours** (<https://www.harriertours.com/>) which is owned by Harriet Kemigisha. This was a very good decision as Harriet’s team has been extremely efficient in the field, knowing where to look for and dedicating a lot of time and commitment to our combined quest for mammals and birds. Harriet herself was not available for our adventure through Uganda but her (very!) incredible guide Sam joined us for the whole duration of the trip. Bosco was our second guide and driver for most of the trip (who replaced Fred who started our itinerary as initial driver). Both Sam and Bosco are very knowledgeable field guides and their combined effort has been amazing. An extraordinary component of their expertise is actually also how good they are at both mammals and birds, which was amazing for us. It very quickly felt like we were a team and both of them became good friends along the way. The various site guides organized by Harriet at the different visited locations were also very good assets. Their local knowledge as well as their friendliness and professionalism were all amazing: especially Raymond at the Royal Mile, Alex in Semuliki and Rodgers at Bigodi Wetland Sanctuary really shone with their knowledge. Thanks very much really to all the team members of Harrier Tours for this amazing trip!

A combination of this amazing team, a lot of preparation and reading before reaching Uganda, fourteen full days in the field (circled with a few days before and after with Entebbe as a base), a large array of activities (game drives, walks, night activities including drives and walks, boat rides, cave scanning, etc.) and some luck brought us **a total of 94 mammal species and 359 bird species** (see full lists below).

As mentioned earlier, this includes **all 25 species of primates occurring in Uganda**, unexpected surprises as a **Giant Pangolin** (in Queen Elizabeth NP) or a **White-tailed Sengi** (in Semuliki NP), 9 species of squirrels (including **Lord Derby’s Anomalure**), 6 species of mongooses, the long sought-after **Giant Forest Hog** (in Queen Elizabeth NP), etc.

The **Angola colobus** (*Colobus angolensis ruwenzorii*) almost eluded us and remained a mystery for most trip until Edward in Lake Nabugabo was able to show us a small population of these primates on the very last day of our field trip, therefore rounding up our chase of the 25 primate species of Uganda. A special thanks to him!

We saw **more than a third of all bird species occurring in the whole of Uganda** (and we only travelled to some particular regions of the country!), including the very unique **Shoebill** (in Mabamba), 4 species of turacos (missing unfortunately the Rwenzori Turaco), the coveted **African Skimmer**, 5 species of storks, 11 species of herons and allies, 28 species of hawks, eagles and kites, 8 species of hornbills, 10 species of kingfishers (including the **Giant Kingfisher**), 10 species of bee-eaters, 14 species of sunbirds, 23 species of weavers and allies, and many, many more!

All the places and locations visited were amazing and added extremely well to the global itinerary. We can only recommend strongly to discover Uganda and its unique biodiversity richness, with Harrier Tours!
